



Castejón de Sos is a town located in the district of Ribagorza, in the area of Alto Ésera, towards the north-east of the province of Huesca. It lies in the heart of the Pyrenees and in the historic earldom of Ribagorza. It comprises the origins of Castejón de Sos, Liri, Ramastué and El Run.

Located at a height of 904 m, the climate is not extreme in winter, protected as it is by the winds from the north, while summers are mild and pleasant.

One of the great attractions of this valley is the landscape. It is surrounded by the highest summits of the mountain chains of the Pyrenees, and is one of the most wild and stimulating ranges of the Aragonese Pyrenees. The mountains of Castejón de Sos extend from a height of 800 m at the entrance to Congosto de Ventamillo to 2,749 m at Tuca Cibollés, along almost 2,000 m of high ground. This allows the discovery of the greater part of the enormous wealth, both for its variety as well as its originality, of indigenous flora and fauna of the Pyrenees.

Its rich historic past and the role that the region played in the birth of the Kingdom of Aragon have culminated in a rich and interesting heritage, in which the Lombard-Romanesque examples that exist at the valley's shrines and churches are exemplary.

It is characterised for its role as a Regional Service Centre. This includes a health centre with 24 hours on duty service. Given its geographic location, it is the main communications hub of the area, and is an ideal setting-off point for discovering other areas of the Pyrenees, such as the region of Ribagorza, the Ordesa and Chistau valleys in Huesca; and the Arán Valley, Bohí-Tahull and Aiguestortes, in Lérida.

Its tourist infrastructure makes it possible to choose the kind of accommodation and services that may be of interest to each visitor in this region. From family-run hotels and boarding houses, rural tourism apartments and youth hostels, through to a comfortable campsite located next to the town's sporting facilities. There are also a large number of businesses of all kinds: groceries, gifts and sports which, together with other establishments such as offices, banks, chemist, post office, hairdresser's, bars, cafes, restaurants, etc., cater for a wide range of tourist requirements
